NOTICE TO RESIDENTS - Union Township Tax Collector - Berks County **Treasurer's Office (County/Municipal Real Estate)**

On January 15, 2026, the Union Township Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 2026-11, naming the Berks County Treasurer's Office as the Tax Collector for Union Township.

There are three (3) ways residents can pay their County/Municipal tax bills.

- A link has been added to the main page of the Township's website for residents who wish to pay county/municipal real estate tax bills electronically. (no delinquent bills can be paid electronically).
- Bills can be mailed to the Berks County Treasurer's Office, 633 Court Street, 2nd Floor, Reading, PA 19601. (call 610.478.6640 for additional information)
- At the Township Building during business hours, payments will not be accepted unless a copy of the tax bill is provided with the payment.

Notice to Residents

Burn ban went into effect for Union Township March 12, 2026, prohibiting all open burning, including yard waste, brush, and recreational fire pits. This ban is active until further notice, all outdoor burning is prohibited, with no exceptions.

- **Age Criteria**
 - 65 and older
 - Widows and widowers 50 and older
 - People with disabilities 18 and older
- **Income Criteria**
 - In addition to age requirements, to qualify for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate, your household income must be \$48,110.00 or less annual

NATURE FEST 2026!

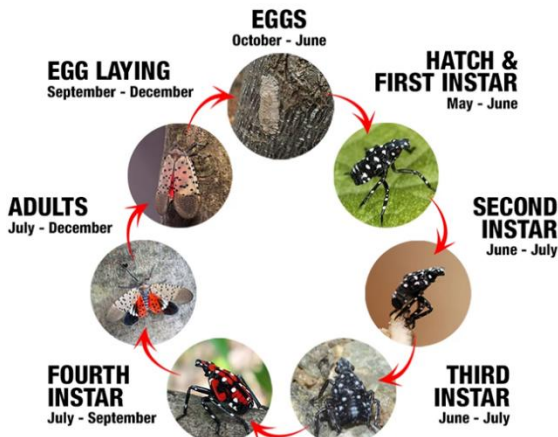

Keep Your Eyes Out for Spotted Lanternfly!

As you probably know by now, Berks County has been filled with spotted lanternflies over the last decade. In case you do not know, these insects are an invasive species and they are causing damage to our native plants and offsetting balanced ecosystems. They like to feed on trees (tree of heaven, birch, maple, black walnut, and others) as well as woody shrubs and vines (grape vines, roses, honeysuckle, etc.). As lanternflies feed, they release a clear liquid called honeydew. The honeydew falls onto leaves and branches and cultivates the black mold that you may have noticed on trees in the area. This mold



harms the plants and makes them more susceptible to death. But we can help take care of our plants by squishing spotted lanternflies! The eggs will likely hatch between April and May, so keep your eyes out for the different life cycle forms of this invasive pest. And if you see them, squish them!

All events will be at Union Meadows, 100 Campbellford Road, Douglassville, PA 19518.

- 1) **Early Migrants.** Presented by Baird Ornithological Club at Union Meadows Park on April 18th, 8:00 am. This is a very popular venue for birders eager to get out in the early spring and observe a number of perching birds passing through on their way to final nesting destinations at higher altitudes. Look for migrant warblers, thrushes, sparrows, vireos and other songbirds that travel northward along this riparian corridor. Rusty Blackbird has consistently been found here in late winter and spring. Walks here typically record high species counts. This event begins with quite a chill in the air but when the April sun burns off the mist, it ends up being balmy; dress in layers. - 2) Baird Ornithological Club is also presenting another walk at Union Meadows on March 15th, 7:00 pm. Listen for and try to glimpse the crepuscular American Woodcock as it performs its courtship flights. For additional details contact the coordinator – Jay Kline 610-858-5130.

- 3) **Beekeeping.** Join us with Mark Engle from Engle Hollow Apiaries and representing the Berks Schuylkill Beekeepers Association on May 2, 2026, 1:00 pm – 2/2:30 pm. (Rain Date May 3rd) The BSBA is a community of beekeeping enthusiasts dedicated to sharing knowledge, promoting best practices, and supporting the health of honeybee populations. Have you ever wondered what it takes to



keep bees? Whether you're curious about honey production, pollination, or just want to connect with nature, this is a perfect program to attend. Come see live bees in their habitat as well as touch and examine items necessary for beekeeping.

- 4) **Touch-a-Truck.** Celebrate the end of the school year with Union Township's Road Crew and their truck/equipment, Birdsboro/Union Fire Department, Monarch Fire Dept, Tower Health Ambulance, Berk's County Sheriff's office with Prison Transport Van, and State Police on June 6th, from 1:00 – 3:00pm. (Rain Date June 7th). Birdsboro Union and Monarch Fire companies, PA State Police and PA Search & Rescue with K-9, and Hopewell Furnace will also be on site. (this is a hands-on event)



- 5) **Wildflowers and Pollinators at Union Meadows West.** Presented by Mengel Natural History Society at Union Township's Butterfly Meadows, July, 18th at 10:00 am. A meandering path through this pollinator meadow provides good access for observing and netting a variety of species. All levels of interest are welcome: children, adults of all ages, novices and advanced. *Close focusing binoculars and a camera will be helpful. For a good look we will capture some insects and put them in viewing jars so you can get a close look before releasing them. Listen to educators about the various butterflies, dragonflies, plants, and insects you'll find at the meadow.

- 6) **Haunting for Candy at Union Meadows.** On Saturday, October 24th, 1:00-4:00 pm, (Rain Date: Sunday, October 25th). Bring the family out for our fun annual Boo Bash! Holiday trick-or-treat on the trail, pumpkin painting, and Blind Candy Taste Test Challenge, among other family friendly activities.
